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It's normal for tweens to be mildly oppositional and argumentative as they begin to try to separate from their parents. 3. Tweens may struggle with social skills and they may report frequent disagreements with friends. They also tend to lack the ability to recognize the long-term consequences of their behavior.

They may interfere with the child's intellectual development. They may be forbidden by law, ethics, religion, or social mores. They might include very aggressive or destructive behavior, overt racism or prejudice, stealing, truancy, smoking or substance abuse, school failure, or an intense sibling rivalry.
