The water industry was privatised in 1989, according to the Conservative government's programme. The water privatisation in England and Wales involved the transfer of the provision of water and wastewater services in England and Wales from the state to the private sector in 1989, through the sale of the ten regional water authorities (RWA).

In 2009, it was estimated that 25% of piped water services is provided by private operators¹. The WSS sector has no central legislation, in that there is no one single law that governs both water supply and sanitation sector, and there is no single national government institution that is tasked with overseeing the operation of the sector.
